For Winter/Spring 2022, all courses are being offered in person. Masks required.

Required Healthcare Orientation for CNA, MA & Eye Care Tech only (Prerequisite for Enrollment)

Students may register in the Certified Nursing Assistant or Eye Care Tech program after they have attended an orientation and passed a reading assessment (given at end of orientation). Students may register in Medical Assistant programs (space permitting) any time after they have attended an orientation and provided proof of HS diploma or GED certificate. Orientations will be held in person. <u>Masks required</u>. All orientations are free of charge. Register online. Additional dates may be added. Please check mvla.net/AS for updates. **Upcoming orientation dates:** Nov 19, Dec 3, Dec 10, and 13. Check page 3 or online for dates/times.

Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) Program (Articulation with Mission College Courses AH 020D/AH 020E for 5.5 credits)

The Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) program prepares students for entry-level employment in skilled nursing and long-term care facilities and equips them to pass the state certification examination. Students must successfully complete 80 hours of classroom instruction and 100 hours of supervised clinical training. Depending on the facility, clinical training may start as early as 7:00AM (day program) or 3:00PM (evening program) for Fall and Winter/Spring sessions. ALL required paperwork is due before start of program. Free mandatory resume workshop. Job placement assistance provided. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructors: Criselda Imperio (AM), Lovejoy Langundino (PM).

Prerequisites: Students must attend a required healthcare orientation prior to registering for this program. Register online at mvla.net/AS. Check page 3 and mvla.net/AS for upcoming dates and information. Medical Terminology Fundamentals course is highly recommended.

Students need to wear navy blue scrubs and white solid shoes while at school and in clinical and must provide proof of valid TB test and immunizations before start of program. Flu shot required between October and April. In addition, students are required to obtain Live Scan fingerprinting and provide the school with a copy of the live scan form. A fingerprinting form and information about Live Scan locations will be provided during orientation.



This is an in-person course. Classes will begin in the classroom at the MVLA Adult School. In the event of a school closure, classes will transition to distance learning. Clinical rotation will take place at a clinical site. In the event that a clinical site is unable to take students, clinical training hours will be temporarily simulated/ demonstrated online on distance learning platforms, Zoom and Google Classroom. Specified face-to-face skills will resume when clinical sites are open to students and/ or when the MVLA Adult School reopens and skills lab/ classroom are accessible. Additional course information will be provided to students during the first week of the program.

Home Health Aide (HHA) Certification Course (48 hrs) - Articulation with Mission College Courses AHL 020F and AHL 020G for 2.0 credits

Home Health Aide is one of the fastest growing careers in the United States and is projected to grow by 38% through 2024. This is a 48-hour course that focuses on developing skills related to the care of clients in their own homes. Students must successfully complete 24 hours of classroom instruction and 24 hours of supervised clinical training. Attend both of our CNA/ HHA courses and become dually certified by the State of California. In-person skills practice will take place at approved clinical sites. In the event that the clinical site is not available for clinical skills practice due to COVID-19 limitations, small cohorts of students can complete the skills practice requirement in the adult school skills lab, according to safety guidelines provided by CDPH. ALL required paperwork is due before start of program. Free mandatory resume workshop. Job placement assistance provided. Masks required. Instructor: Staff

Students need to wear navy blue scrubs and white solid shoes while at school and in clinical, and must provide proof of valid TB test and immunizations before start of program. Flu shot required between October and April.

Basic Life Support (BLS) for Healthcare Providers - Classroom

In this classroom-based course, healthcare professionals learn to recognize several life-threatening emergencies, provide CPR to victims of all ages, use an AED, and relieve choking in a safe, timely, and effective manner. Successful course completion requires full participation in classroom and skills sessions, as well as successful performance in skill and knowledge evaluations. Please wear comfortable clothing. Instructor: Kimberly Kunde.

Acute Care Program (100+ hrs)

This program prepares the long term care nurse assistant to function at a competent level in the acute care setting. The course builds upon previously-learned CNA skills and consists of a lecture and practicum component. Depending on the facility, clinical training may start as early as 7:00AM, and urine and drug screening may be requested. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Criselda Imperio.

Current CNA certificate required. Students need to wear navy blue scrubs and white solid shoes at all times and must provide proof of valid TB test and immunizations. Flu shot required between October and April.

NEW! Eye Care Technician (Optometric Assistant)

This in-person course is designed for students seeking a career in the healthcare field with emphasis on optometry and eye care. Eye Care Technicians are part of the vision care team. They work with the optometrist to assist patients with front office customer service, pre-testing evaluations and eyewear selection needs. This course is the first step on your career ladder to become an Optician, Frame Stylist, or Paraoptometric Coding Specialist.

Students who are interested in the optician assistant program will learn clinical, customer service, sales, eyewear styling skills, and how to work with ophthalmologists and optometrists. Students who complete this course will have the opportunity to participate in an optician assistant externship to get hands-on practice. This course will prepare students for the anatomy/physiology portion of the National Optician Competency exam administered by the American Board of Opticianry (ABO). <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Mira Singer

Workshops for CNA/HHA Certificate Renewal – Continuing Education Units (CEUs)

As a California Certified Nursing Assistant you need to have 48 hours of continuing education to renew your certificate. In addition, you must show proof that you have worked at least one paid day within 2 years in a facility where you provided nursing related services. A California Home Health Aide must complete 24 hours of CEUs within 2 years. Don't allow your certificate to expire! We offer classes and workshops to keep your certificate current. Choose from one of the options to meet your CEU requirements. All classes have been approved by the California Department of Public Health and qualify for CEUs. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Tamara Rood-Spenker, RN

These workshops are in-person classes held at MVLA Adult School. In the event of a school closure, the classroombased workshops will transition to an online distance learning platform, via Zoom, with additional coursework provided via Google Classroom. Students will need to download and install the Zoom application on a computer, tablet, mobile phone, or other device with an Internet connection and microphone/webcam. Instructor will email additional course information to students prior to the first day of class.

Students must have a current CNA/HHA certificate in order to participate in the workshops. When registering, type in your name as it appears on your CNA/HHA certificate. Medical Terminology Parts 1 & 2

These foundational courses are designed for students seeking a career in the healthcare field. They will focus on introducing students to the vocabulary used by medical professionals in medical offices, hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and other healthcare settings. Students will learn the basic rules of medical terminology and explore the word roots, suffixes and prefixes, and combining forms commonly used. Students learn to spell, define, and pronounce common medical terms as well as abbreviations. In this course, students will have a general overview of all body systems and their functions. It also covers disease transmission, and body directions, planes, and cavities. <u>Masks required</u>. Medical Assistant Training Program National Certification (NCMA) – Front and Back Office

This program prepares students to qualify for entry-level positions in private practices, group practices, urgent care facilities, and hospitals. Medical assistants perform administrative and clinical tasks related to Front and Back Office to keep medical practices running smoothly. The course combines classroom instruction with a lab practicum component. Students are required to complete 375 hours of theory/lab before they take the national certification test, followed by 160 hours of externship, which provides students with the necessary practice and skills. A typing test should be taken to assess a student's ability to type 35 words per minute.

Free mandatory resume workshop. Job placement assistance provided. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Dr. Abhaya Karangutkar. The MA classes fill up quickly! We recommend attending an orientation as early as 6 months before the class start date.

Prerequisites: Students must attend a required Healthcare orientation prior to registering for this program. Check page 3 or mvla.net/AS for upcoming dates and to register. Medical Terminology Parts 1 & 2 are highly recommended.

Medical Office Assistant National Certification (NCMOA)

This course provides students with the tools and skills they need to work in a medical front office setting. Students will be trained in insurance, medical terminology, law and ethics, and general office management duties. The course content prepares them to find employment in a variety of medical settings such as physicians' offices, clinics, hospitals, dental offices, foundations, insurance companies, and managed care organizations. Students who complete this course will receive a Medical Office Assistant program certificate. Students who complete this course are eligible to take the certification test through the National Center for Competency Testing (NCCT) and receive a NCMOA. This program includes a free optional resume workshop and provides job placement assistance. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Dr. Abebe Gelagay

MEDICAL RECORDS SPECIALIST CERTIFICATE

National Certification (National Certified Insurance and Coding Specialist - NCICS)

Students who complete both Electronic Health Record Keeping and Medical Billing & Coding are eligible to take the National Certification Test for Insurance and Coding Certification through NCCT. Students are required to complete an externship of 100 hours in order to receive a Medical Records Specialist school certificate. Free optional resume workshop and job placement assistance available.

Medical Billing and Coding

Medical Insurance plays an important role in the financial well-being of every healthcare business. This course provides the students with knowledge of the fundamentals of ICD-10 and CPT coding, managed-care contracts, reimbursement procedures, and insurance referrals for the healthcare industry. In addition, students will obtain the basic knowledge of the billing and coding procedures for medical practice. Students will learn how to code and enter information into a computer system and understand how an invoice is generated and sent to the patient. Students completing this course will receive a course completion certificate for Medical Insurance Billing and Coding. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Dr. Abebe Gelagay

This course introduces students to the concepts and skills they will need for a successful career in medical office billing and computerized practice management. Students will acquire an in-depth knowledge of the medical billing cycle and the use of health information technology in physicians' practices. The course centers on an advanced MediSoft V19 training, where students will practice hands-on how to enter patient information, work with cases, create claims, post insurance payments, create reports, and schedule. Students completing this course will receive a course completion certificate for Electronic Health Record Keeping. <u>Masks required</u>. Instructor: Dr. Abebe Gelagay
