



#### Physical Therapy Technician/Aide Program Physical Therapy Technician/Aide Certification (PTTC/PTAC) through American Medical Certification Association (AMCA)

Physical Therapy Technicians/Aides work under the direction and supervision of Physical Therapists. They help patients who are recovering from injuries and illnesses regain movement and manage pain. Duties include preparing the patient and the treatment area, setting up therapy equipment, washing linens, helping patients move to or from a therapy area, clerical tasks, and preparing patient transport. Physical Therapy Technicians/ Aides usually work in physical therapy offices, hospitals, post and sub-acute care facilities. #### Medical Assistant Training Program National Certification (NCMA) – Front and Back Office (CCBMA Test Optional)

This program prepares students to qualify for entry-level positions in private practices, group practices, urgent care facilities, and hospitals. Medical assistants perform administrative and clinical tasks related to Front and Back Office to keep medical practices running smoothly. The course combines classroom instruction with a lab practicum component. Students are required to complete 375 hours of theory/lab before they take the national certification test, followed by 160 hours of externship, which provides students with the necessary practice and skills. A typing test is given to assess student's ability to type 35 words per minute.
