HIGH SCHOOL ONLINE SUMMER SCHOOL 2020 FAQ

Question	Response
1. How do I sign my student up for High School Online Summer School?	 For all courses (except Health), district high school students should email their high school counselor. Visit <u>www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer</u> to register. Students can register online or waitlist if a class is full. ALL students (except Health) must also submit an application found at <u>www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer</u> to their high school counselor. NOTE: ALL Health applications should be sent to <u>Ariel.Rojas@mvla.net</u> for approval.
2. How does the program work?	 Online Summer School will be held through a 100% distance learning format during the COVID-19 shelter in place. Students are required to complete a mandatory online orientation before the first day of their assigned session. Each student is assigned a teacher who is available to provide one on one support during online office hours (M-F, 9 am to 3 pm). Each session is 10 business days long but students are able to finish early if they choose.
3. What are the hours for Online Summer School?	 Students can access their courses online 24/7. Online office hours are held Monday-Friday from 9am-3pm.
4. Where is the orientation? Will it be online?	• After May 15, students will receive a confirmation email providing information on how to access the online orientation. Once student has finished viewing the video, they will be asked to complete a google survey to verify completion of this requirement.
5. Can my student work on more than one course at a time?	 No. All Students work on one course at a time. As soon as they finish their first course, the next will be opened for them. They should inform their teacher when they finish.
6. How many times does my student have to come in?	Students will not be required to come in for testing during the COVID-19 shelter in place. Final grades will be weighted using the following scale: 33.3% assignments, 33.3% quizzes, 33.3% projects
7. Who gets priority enrollment for Online Summer School (including Health)?	 Nongraduating seniors and rising seniors will get the highest priority.
8. If a student is continuing a course from the regular school year, do they still need an application?	• Yes! Every student needs to submit an application. Students taking/continuing a course that is not Health must have a counselor approval on their application in order to finalize enrollment.
