

HIGH SCHOOL ONLINE SUMMER SCHOOL 2020 FAQ

Question	Response
1. How do I sign my student up for High School Online Summer School?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> For all repeat courses (except for Health) district high school students should see their high school counselor. Students can register online as well but will only be waitlisted until we receive counselor permission on the Summer School application. For Health, Visit www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer to register. ALL students must also submit a paper application found at www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer or from their high school counselor. NOTE: Applications for Health do NOT need a counselor signature. All other courses require counselor approval.
2. How does the program work?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Online Summer School is an independent studies, blended-model distance learning program. Students must attend mandatory orientation on the first day of their session. Each student is assigned a teacher who is available to provide one on one support during operating hours (M-F, 9 am to 3 pm). Students are required to come into the lab to take all tests and exams (minimum of 3 visits for tests/exams). All other assignments can be completed outside of lab. Each session is 10 business days long but students are able to finish early if they choose.
3. What are the hours for Online Summer School?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students can access their courses online 24/7. Lab 104 is open Monday-Friday, from 9am-3pm.
4. Where is the orientation?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> MVLA Adult School at 333 Moffett Blvd., Mountain View. Students with confirmed enrollment just need to show up. There will be multiple rooms for orientation, all giving the same information.
5. My student cannot make the orientation at 9am, what should we do?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Sessions 1 and 2 both have a 3 pm orientation option. Reserved for In-Seat MVHS summer school students and special cases. Students can also schedule a one on one orientation with the Program Coordinator via phone or email.
6. Can my student work on more than one course at a time?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> No. All Students work on one course at a time. As soon as they finish their first course, the next will be opened for them. They should inform their teacher or coordinator when they finish.
7. Can my student attend the first session orientation even though they want to be in the second or third session?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> We prefer students attend orientation during the session they wish to attend so the information is helpful. Students can schedule a one on one orientation the Program Coordinator if they are unable to make the scheduled orientations via phone or email.

8. How many times does my student have to come in?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> At minimum, students will come in 4 times. 1- Mandatory Orientation (for ALL students) 2- Units 1 and 2 Tests 3- Units 3 and 4 Tests 4- Unit 5 Test and Semester Final*
9. Can my student come in more often/everyday?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yes! Students are welcome to work in the lab during our operating hours. M-F, 9 to 3 pm. Students are also allowed to take one Unit test at a time as long as all of the assignments for said unit have been completed.
10. Who gets priority enrollment for Online Summer School (including Health)?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Upperclassman (incoming juniors and seniors) may visit their counselors for permission to take one of the limited priority spots. Incoming seniors will get the highest priority.
11. Is there still room in classes that are not Health?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yes! Students may waitlist (only) for the course and session of their choice ,and we will complete their enrollment once we have received their application with a counselor's signature.
12. If a student is continuing a course from the regular school year, do they still need an application?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Yes! Every student needs to submit an application. Students taking/continuing a course that is not Health must have a counselor signature on their application in order to finalize enrollment.
13. What are the testing dates?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students are able to go at their own pace as long as it is within their two-week session. Therefore, testing is done on a drop in basis during our program's operating hours of M-F, 9 am to 3 pm.
