

HIGH SCHOOL ONLINE SUMMER SCHOOL 2020 FAQ

1. How do I sign my student up for High School Online Summer School?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For all courses (except Health), district high school students should email their high school counselor. • Visit www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer to register. • Students can register online or waitlist if a class is full. • ALL students (except Health) must also submit an application found at www.mvla.net/AS/HSD/Summer to their high school counselor. • NOTE: ALL Health applications should be sent to Ariel.Rojas@mvla.net for approval.
2. How does the program work?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Online Summer School will be held through a 100% distance learning format during the COVID-19 shelter in place. • Students are required to complete a mandatory online orientation before the first day of their assigned session. • Each student is assigned a teacher who is available to provide one on one support during online office hours (M-F, 9 am to 3 pm). • Each session is 10 business days long but students are able to finish early if they choose.
3. What are the hours for Online Summer School?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Students can access their courses online 24/7. • Online office hours are held Monday-Friday from 9am-3pm.
4. Where is the orientation? Will it be online?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • After May 15, students will receive a confirmation email providing information on how to access the online orientation. Once student has finished viewing the video, they will be asked to complete a google survey to verify completion of this requirement.
5. Can my student work on more than one course at a time?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No. All Students work on one course at a time. • As soon as they finish their first course, the next will be opened for them. • They should inform their teacher when they finish.
6. How many times does my student have to come in?	<p>Students will not be required to come in for testing during the COVID-19 shelter in place. Final grades will be weighted using the following scale: 33.3% assignments, 33.3% quizzes, 33.3% projects</p>
7. Who gets priority enrollment for Online Summer School (including Health)?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Nongraduating seniors and rising seniors will get the highest priority.
8. If a student is continuing a course from the regular school year, do they still need an application?	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yes! Every student needs to submit an application. Students taking/continuing a course that is not Health must have a counselor approval on their application in order to finalize enrollment.
